**SRBV Disciplinary Hearing into the Professional Conduct of Michael Hand LS (Regn No. 1271)**

On 18 March 2009, the Surveyors Registration Board of Victoria received a complaint about the professional conduct of Mr Michael Hand LS.

The complaint related to a claim of excessive delays by the licensed surveyor in supplying survey documentation with consequent delay in registration of a subdivision and the issuing of titles.

The Board's Investigation Committee recommended a formal hearing before a Panel of Board Members.

The outcome of the hearing, which was conducted on 19 and 30 June 2009, is as follows:

**Findings:** That the complaint was made out in that the Licensed Surveyor had engaged in unprofessional conduct which was not of a serious nature.

**Determination:** That the Licensed Surveyor be cautioned.
